Children in Need on Friday 17th



Mr Smith's PE Award



Safeguarding

Parent Council Meeting

Last week, Mrs Jones and I met with the Parent Council representatives. It was a really positive meeting. We discussed communication and the sharing of our Positive Behaviour Policy. At Styal, overwhelmingly, the aim is to 'catch children being good' and rewarding this with praise, stickers, certificates, house points and rewards in assembly and on the newsletter.

We also support our children to understand their behaviour through our Friendship Terrace work. This is a set of 10 stories about a set of characters that live in terrace houses. The character Friendly Freddie helps the others (eg Fitzroy First, Rough Ryan and Manisha Mine) to be better friends. We visit these in class and whole school assemblies.

This term we have also introduced Zones of Regulation to help children manage their thoughts, feelings and actions. It is already having a great impact to help our children to self-regulate their behaviour.

We have our yellow, double yellow and red card consequences (developed by our children). The children decided the behaviours they didn't want in school and even ranked them in order from the most severe. What I was particularly impressed by was the fact I would have written the same list and ranked them in just the same way! It just shows the emotional intelligence of our children. Red card reflection time is carried out to support children to understand and amend their behaviour. It is important that we get this part right so children understand the behaviours that are unacceptable. This time invested with the children is crucial to ensure our school is happy and safe...and it works.

If we were concerned about a child's behaviour, we would contact families to discuss it further. Working in partnership with you is what allows us to support our children really well.

Y5 / 6 93.14%


I was thrilled to see that we have met our 95% target for whole school attendance this week. Thank you to our families for their support.



On Monday, the school received a very special letter!


It was sent to us by King Charles and Queen Camilla to thank our children for sending cards and sharing work to commemorate their coronation.
