Thank you for joining in our recent survey.

Here is a quick guide on returning to school in September, which has been designed to answer the questions submitted.

Will children be wearing school uniform in September?

Yes

Children will be allowed to wear black trainers as part of the uniform for the first half term.
(Please see notes below on PE lessons.)

Will children bring home reading books?

Yes

Books will be put to one side for 48 hours in school before sending them home with another child.

Will children bring bags to school in September?

Yes

Children may bring to school a lunch box, hat, coat and bag. Children will have their own pencil / pen as far as possible.

Will children wear PE kits?

Yes

Children will come to school dressed in their PE kits on their class' PE day. This will be communicated with you nearer the time.

Children will be able to wear black trainers as part of school uniform for the first half term. This is to ensure that all children can access their PE lessons, even if they forget to wear their PE kit.

We believe that PE is essential for health and also emotional wellbeing.



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Will there be after school sports clubs such as football club?

Yes

We have worked hard to reintroduce sports clubs safely in September. Therefore, we are offering clubs to specific class 'bubbles' to avoid mixing. Children attending sports clubs, will attend school in their PE kit on that day.

Will Breakfast Club and After School Club be safe?

Yes

Safety is our priority. Numbers will be limited in the first instance. Social distancing protocols will be followed at drop off and pick up times. Hand washing and respiratory measures will be adhered to and extra cleaning measures used. We are expecting further government guidance at the beginning of August. School class 'bubbles' may be kept separate in the hall if guidance stipulates.

Will children mix between bubbles?

No

Bubbles will be kept separate. The emphasis is on separate groups rather than social distancing, especially for younger children.

How will staff be managed?

The government guidance is to limit the number of pupils and staff in contact with each other.



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Will the school office be open?

Yes

The school office will be open in September and we will be happy to help - just like we always have done.

However, parents should contact the office staff via telephone or email only in the first instance.

This is to keep everyone safe and to ensure that large numbers of people are not crowded into our small office area.

Can I just walk into the school office without an appointment?

No

There may be times when you need to speak face to face to a member of the Styal team. You may need to look at the lost property which will be held outside the school office area.

This can be accommodated, but it will need to be by appointment only. Please telephone the school office in the first instance.
