

Isaac has kicked off the new year with a fantastic win. His football team won the South Manchester Football League. They


will be presented with the cup very soon.




Mrs Boardman's Award

A message from Cheshire East to all families

All families and young people need a bit of help from time to time and the **Family Help Team** are here to do just that.

We have a **drop-in session** at each of our Family Hubs/Children's Centres where members of the team will be on hand to provide free information, advice and support. We support families with children aged 0-19 (25 with special educational needs and disabilities) and we aim to make it easier for you to ask for help, and get you the right support at the right time and if this isn't us we will make sure you are in touch with other services which may be able to help, this may include support around managing challenges at home, keeping you and your family safe and queries around accessing other services.
