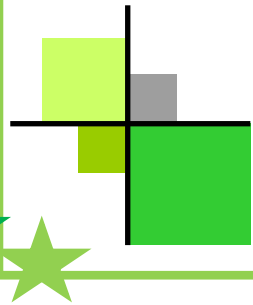

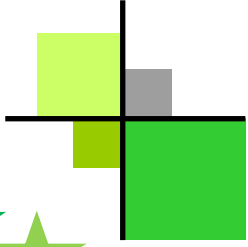


### Sports for Schools

We raised £195 and this will be used to enable Sports for Schools to keep running and support and fund top athletes to compete and train at the highest level.





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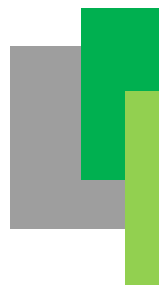
**Goodbye—I am so sad to be leaving**
