We would like to invite the children to come to school dressed in something red.


In addition to this, we have asked the children in assembly this week to bring their favourite joke to school on Friday.

We look forward to seeing you then.




Mr Smith's PE Awards























Great Work

determination to challenge himself in maths finding different number bonds to 100.




Ava, Isobel, Olivia and Kali have been awarded their Blue Peter badges for sending in their stories and creations.




British Science Week


Super Science in Year 3 and 4

Eureka Trip for Year 5 and 6





Litter Poster Competition


