They also went into the car park where and Mrs




#### Mr Smith's PE Awards


## **Red Nose Day**


### Headteacher's Award








It was lovely to see you at open afternoon where the children had an opportunity to share their learning with you.

#### **Football**



At Styal, we pride ourselves on being as inclusive as we can to give **EVERY** child in our school the most comfortable day we can.

We make many adaptations for our young people throughout the school day so that our children are in the best possible place to learn and be happy.

These can help all our children.

One of these adaptations is to replace clapping in assemblies with the sign for clapping (seen in the photo above). Sudden onset of noise can be very dysregulating for children (particularly as they might not have gained the social cues that clapping is coming). You may have experienced this around hand dryers in public toilets and how that can alarm a young child as they have a sudden onset of sound that appears to be random. As children learn the social cues around hand dryers they can be better placed to predict that the hand dryer will start so become more able to tolerate it.

However, some people will also struggle with this.

Therefore, we have made the decision to clap with no noise but a very visual sign to show our appreciation. This has been used for years in schools with a silent cheer.
