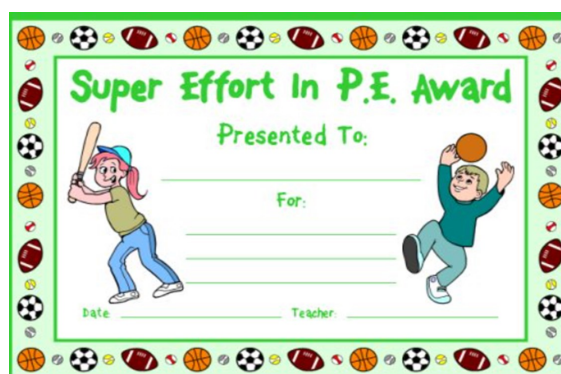

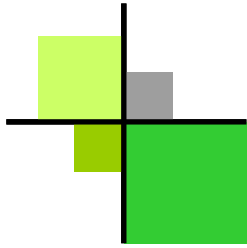

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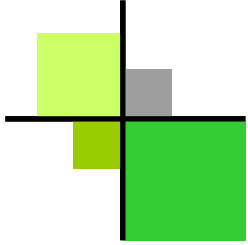
Easter Egg Competition

Thank you to everyone who entered the Easter Egg Competition. We had so many creative designs and so much effort had been put into the designs.

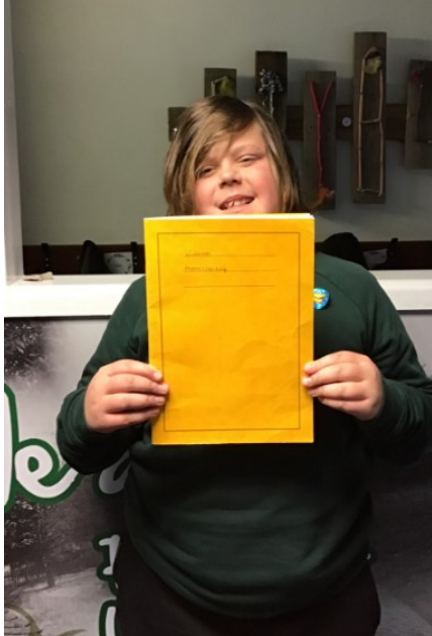

He was extremely proud of himself and so were his teachers.

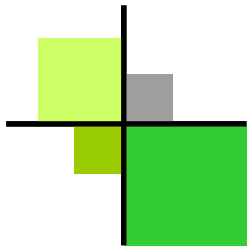
