Mr Smith's PE Awards


Mr Smith has chosen from KS1 for growing in confidence, and Isaac H from KS2 for superb leadership skills.



The courses are often free of charge.


Mrs Holliday has attended a number of these courses and has found them invaluable. They offer support for blended families and single parenting, as well as podcasts and resources for you to use.
