### Y6 SATS results ... AMAZING!

Huge congratulations to our <u>Y6 2025</u> class who achieved the most amazing SATS results.

Incredible work from the children and the team.

We are so proud!

- We were above National Average with 62.5%
   Reading, Writing & Maths combined score.
- 12% of our children achieved a Greater Depth combined score.
- We were above National Average with87.5% achieving Expected level in Reading.
- 25% of our children achieved a Greater Depth
   Reading score.
- We were above National Average with 75% achieving Expected level in Writing.
  - 18.8% of our children achieved a Greater
     Depth Writing score.
- We were above National Average with 75%
   achieving Expected level in Maths.
- 31% of our children achieved a Greater Depth
   Maths score.
  - We were above National Average
     with 81% achieving Expected level in SPaG.
    - 25% of our children achieved aGreater Depth SPaG score.

A huge thank you to **Parents of Styal** for their incredible work over the last academic year. Our school community have been so lucky to access such great events and activities.






