#### **Attendance**

As you will see later in the attendance section of the newsletter, our attendance percentages have crept up again this week which is great.


However, as we start our new academic year it would be fantastic if, as a whole school we can keep above that **95% mark** and that each class can too.

We know that children get poorly, especially when returning to school after a long break. However, every session that your child is in school is important and missing school soon adds up to significant learning time being missed.

Please work with us to ensure that your children have access to maximum learning opportunities. Thank you!

- 95% attendance means 50 missed lessons. This means a child missed about 10 days or 2 weeks of lessons in the school year.
- 90% attendance means 100 missed lessons. This means a child misses 4 weeks of lessons in the school year.
- 85% attendance means 150 missed lessons.
   This means the child misses almost 6 weeks of lessons in the school year
- 80% attendance means 200 missed lessons. This means the child misses over 7 weeks of lessons in the school year
- 75% attendance means 250 missed lessons. This means the child misses about 9 weeks of lessons in the school year







#### **Mr Smith's PE Awards**






